NATIONAL FRATERNITY UPDATES

Recruitment Success

Noteworthy recruitment achievements were observed at the University of Alabama, Texas Christian University, Auburn University, the University of Oklahoma, the University of Arkansas, Sam Houston State University, and Virginia Tech. These chapters excelled, with some achieving new chapter record pledge classes.

The cumulative 629 pledges represent <u>the most</u> significant growth in Fall new member recruitment since the semester of Fall 2018.

Housing Enhancements

Chapters at the University of Tennessee, the University of Texas, the University of Georgia, the University of North Carolina, Southern Methodist University, and Auburn University (six chapters in total) are all situated in traditional fraternity houses, fostering enhanced brotherhood and unity in Christ.

Mercer University BYX recently acquired a house and attained IFC status for the Fall semester.

COR Leadership Retreat

A group of 41 individuals from 22 chapters headed to DFW to learn from alumni leading businesses, families, and faith communities, followed by a ten-day trip to Israel. The group visited over 20 biblical sites, and 15 individuals were baptized during this transformative experience.

Campus Leadership

Southern Methodist University has members serving as Student Body President and IFC President. Texas A&M University has a member holding the position of Student Body President. East Tennessee State University has members assuming roles as incoming IFC President and IFC VP Recruitment. Georgia Southern University has a member serving as IFC President.

Virginia Tech and the **University of Kentucky** achieved the highest fraternity GPAs on campus.

University of North Carolina

Following a campus shooting early in the semester, the University of North Carolina chapter held a spontaneous worship session on their front porch. Twenty Chi Omega girls joined them, as well as several potential new members (PNMs), who expressed that this experience solidified their decision to pledge Beta Upsilon Chi.

Baylor University

In a display of brotherly compassion, the chapter at Baylor University rallied within 24 hours to raise funds for a brother whose mother is undergoing cancer testing. The funds were raised to cover his dues for the year and provide financial support during a challenging time.
